The New Quebec Energy Code for Buildings

Energy codes are continuing to evolve in Canada in response to the challenge of mitigating climate change. This presentation will provide an overview of the new Quebec Energy Code for Buildings which was adopted with amendments on June 27, 2020. The primary focus will be on Part 3, Building Envelope. The objectives of this presentation by the UL Building Envelope Group are to:

- Review the three compliance paths and methods required to demonstrate conformity
- Highlight major modifications and differences vs national baseline energy codes
- Discuss new challenges for building designers, stakeholders and manufactures of the built environment
- Discuss the impact this will have on fenestration and curtain wall systems and a glimpse at innovations and research studies.

SPEAKERS:

CLAUDIO BARDETTI is Technical Director, Consulting and Commissioning in the UL Building Envelope group. After completing his studies in architectural technology and working as a coordinator and assistant superintendent on various institutional, commercial, and residential construction projects, Claudio worked in a number of architectural firms where he collaborated in the design of large-scale building envelopes.
